New draft Mining Charter better than 'disaster' it is replacing — Mohale

<u>Mining Charter</u> is not perfect, but it is better than the "disaster" it is replacing, <u>Business Leadership South Africa CEO</u> <u>Bonang Mohale</u> told attendees at the African <u>Mining Network event on Thursday evening</u>. He explained that the previous draft, which was unilaterally drafted and published by then Mineral <u>Resources</u> Minster <u>Mosebenzi Zwane</u>, had resulted in the loss of 62 000 jobs.

Further, while the latest draft published for comment by Minster <u>Gwede</u>

<u>Mantashe</u> retains some of the contentious elements of the previous draft, namely, the minimum 30% black economic empowerment shareholding,

and a free-carried interest in new <u>mining</u> rights, the Department of Mineral <u>Resources</u> had made several concessions, and remains open to further engagement.

He noted that the 10% free-carried interest requirement should not be a major hurdle.

He pointed to the multinational <u>petrochemicals</u> company <u>Shell</u>, which operates in 114 countries, and in 11 of those countries there is a free-carried requirement, implying that, while burdensome, a free-carried interest requirement will not cripple companies.
